As a result, the effective implementation and wide-range dissemination of sustainable water management policies and practices are becoming more important than ever before. Technical assistance programmes have played a big role in contributing to this objective. Many countries around the world have stepped up to reform their urban water and sanitation service systems. However, often times these reforms have relied on non-utility consultants for specific, short-term projects on water and sewage utilities. Utility-to-utility exchanges have demonstrated to be more promising and effective as an opportunity to scale-	A coordinated partnership platform for water-sector capacity building based on a knowledge dissemination approach greatly benefits societies and target countries through harnessing the shared best practices and challenges of capacity building for water security.
