Session Description including objectives and expected outcomes (500 words maximum):

The session is aimed to be an interactive dialogue to discuss the Water for Shared Prosperity, the book co-authored by the Government of Indonesia and the World Bank.

Following a brief introduction to summarize the book's content, there will be an interactive conversation with representative of the youth, academic, and association of Indonesia's water professional on the following topics:

- Water for shared prosperity from youth perspective (what does it mean? opportunities and challenges for the young generation to contribute to the achievement of its objectives)
- Spotlight on Indonesia:
 - o Water for Shared Prosperity in Indonesia from academic point of view - how Indonesia's universities and research institute contributes to the achievement of water for shared prosperity agenda, challenges and opportunities
 - o Examples of Indonesia's initiatives to achieve water for shared prosperity - how young members of Indonesia's association of professionals can play key role in scaling up, sustaining and further improving the existing good examples and initiatives

The session will be concluded by a closing remark from the World Bank Global Director for Water Global Practice, emphasizing on how the World Bank Group and other development partners in Indonesia can support and collaborate with the youth and young professionals in supporting the Government in achieving Water for Shared Prosperity and in sharing Indonesia's experience with other countries/regions.

Expected outcome: increased awareness and interest of the young generation and professionals to be actively involved in activities, generate ideas and spreading out the messages towards achievement of water for shared prosperity objectives.
