**Session Description including objectives and expected outcomes (500 words maximum):**

Indonesia and The Netherlands have a strong partnership on water, subsurface and climate for many decades. One of the focus areas within this cooperation is *integrated water resilience*, mainly focusing on the northern part of the Island Java and its major urban centers, addressing challenges in an integrated and holistic way such as urban and coastal flooding, land subsidence and coastal erosion and identifying solutions within the realm of green and grey measures. This side-event aims to highlight the longstanding cooperation between the two countries and identify success factors for a strategic and programmatic cooperation in the field of integrated water management, providing concrete showcases on mainstreaming Nature-Based Solutions (NBS) and connecting it in this session to water (and climate) resilience.

The session targets key national and international stakeholders in an interactive manner, aiming to bridge the gap between project inception ('the millions required for the first phases of the project development cycle') and NBS project implementation ('the billions available for financing implementation'), between long term plans and projects and between a siloed technocratic approach and an inclusive and integrated process by zooming in to international water cooperation.

The expected outcomes of this side-event are to (1) create a better understanding about the complexity of urban and coastal water-related issues and the need for integrated, multilevel and green-grey solutions (2) to showcase the advantages of a long-term strategic bilateral cooperation and (3) to promote collaborative and multilevel action, towards enhancing urban and coastal water resilience by a design-driven inclusive approach based on an integral landscape vision, creating maximum impact for the people of Indonesia.
