Target	The Water for Life program has a vital purpose and clear objectives. It aims to serve as a practical solution for beneficiaries in the NTT region facing challenges in accessing clean water. These challenges may arise from inadequate water sources or economic constraints preventing them from implementing drilling-based clean water solutions. Additionally, the program plays a significant role in assisting the government in addressing the pressing clean water issues, particularly in the challenging NTT region. The scarcity of clean water in this area has far-reaching consequences, including exacerbating poverty, hindering access to education, and affecting overall nutrition levels.

Actions and Outcomes	Introducing "Water for Life 2024" program by Humanity First. We aim to drill water wells at 5 locations across Sabu, Timor (Timor Tengah Selatan and Nonbaun districts), Lembata, and Alor Islands, all underserved areas facing water scarcity. Alongside drilling, we'll build infrastructure including piping for household distribution and sanitation facilities. Collaborating with local government and

	<p>communities, we'll establish a managerial system for sustainable maintenance through work groups and continuous citizen contributions. Moreover, the water from these wells will support agricultural needs, promoting Water Security and Prosperity, Water for Humans and Nature, and Sustainable Water Finance.</p>

Financial Commitment	<p>The financial commitments required to build the "Water for Life" project in Nusa Tenggara Timur (East Nusa Tenggara) amount to approximately 250 million Indonesian Rupiah per location. With plans to establish the project in five locations—Sabu Island, Timor Island (Timor Tengah Selatan and Nonbaun districts), Lembata Island, and Alor Island—the total budget needed is 1.5 billion Rupiah. Additionally, the drilling cost estimation in Sabu Island is doubled due to transportation costs, as it is separated by sea from the drilling vendors in Kupang. Therefore, the total budget needed is 1.5 billion Rupiah (around 92K USD).</p>
