	The MYOCEAN Plastic Free School initiative aims to minimize plastic consumption in schools and support their efforts in combating single-use plastic pollution. SMK Seri Pantai, Kuala Lumpur has identified as pioneer school in this effort. It consists of six course modules that can be integrated into existing curriculum or run as extra-curricular activities. By reducing plastic usage, schools can contribute to environmental preservation and promote social justice. This initiative aligns with Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) 13 (Climate Action) and 14 (Life Below Water). It also emphasizes partnerships with local communities, governments, and organizations to amplify the impact and work towards SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals).			
	2. Adopting Water Bodies and Underwater Cleanup:			

The MYOCEAN Adopt the Beach initiative involves adopting water bodies and educating the public about the significance of aquatic ecosystems. It aims to ensure the survival of these ecosystems and the species depending on them. The initiative includes conducting regular cleanups coinciding with global environmental events. Additionally, the Beach Ranger Program is set to launch in Q4 2024, aiming to identify potential candidates interested in becoming Underwater Rangers. Training and certification will be provided for participants to become underwater rangers and underwater conservation specialists.

3. Pulau Tioman Merdeka Sea Challange 2024
The Pulau Tioman Merdeka Sea Challenge 2024 program focuses
on community development, sports development, and environmental
conservation while aligning with sustainable development goals. The
program aims to promote environmental awareness and action
towards marine conservation. It conducts activities such as coral
propagation workshops and underwater clean-up activities to raise
awareness and foster conservation efforts.

In terms of sustainable development goals, the program aligns with SDG 14 (Life Below Water) by emphasizing the sustainable use of marine resources and the conservation of marine habitats. It also contributes to SDG 17 (Partnerships for Goals) by engaging with various stakeholders such as sports organizations, government agencies, and local communities.
