Linkages to SDG 6	Engaging the youth of Bali from various school level/grade in a sustained, multi-year endeavor to plant nine species of sacred trees across mountaintops, riverbanks, slopes surrounding lakes, and coastal plains serves the purpose of slowing down the direct flow of rainwater to the sea. At the same time, we implanting the seed in their memories and heart to love and protect their ancestral land even more.
Target	The objective of the initial phase of the Bali Bersih Lestari program remains somewhat ambiguous to measure. Nevertheless, since 2019, the BPJ Foundation has consistently engaged in meaningful tree planting initiatives across various locations in Bali, particularly during the rainy season. This strategic timing helps to facilitate the healthy growth of seedlings, minimizing the requirement for additional watering.

Actions and Outcomes	From 2024 onwards, the BPJ Foundation will significantly ramp up its efforts in cleaning water catchment areas and planting sacred trees there. The aim is to ensure that within the span of five years, none of Bali's sacred water catchment sites will have a negative reputation.
