Session Description including objectives and expected outcomes (500 words maximum):

The session aims to investigate issues affecting women, children and marginalised groups in access to water and sanitation, and to generate practical responses on how to address these challenges.

Structure of session:

The session will be structured around **10 tables** with the intention that one of the 5 topics is addressed at each of two tables.

A brief introductory presentation will set the context (may include video clips of grassroots people speaking about the challenges that they face in terms of water and sanitation).

Following from this, discussions will take place at each table around a particular topic/question, with the intention of generating solutions that can be taken back by participants into their organisations, work programmes, and can be used for advocacy purposes.

The five tables will each address a different topic/question:

Disaster risk reduction: how does one mitigate the risks felt by women, children and marginalised groups in the context of water-related disasters (floods, droughts, pollution events etc)



Water allocation and protection: How does one address issues of corruption and malfeasance in allocation of water, permits to extract water, permits to mine sand, etc in order to protect the rights of women, children and marginalised groups

Sextortion: What actions can be taken by policy makers, regulators and water services providers to prevent sextortion in access to water?

Weaponisation of water: What actions can be taken at the national, local and/or international level to prevent the weaponisation of water in situations of conflict?

People with disabilities: What actions are needed to address the challenges faced by people with disabilities in accessing water and sanitation services?

In line with the cross-cutting theme for this topic, **Hearing the Unheard**, we will try to ensure that the voices of people from the grassroots are present in the discussion, either through in-person speakers, or through video presentations.

Outcomes: Practical suggestions on how to protect the rights of women, children and marginalised groups in relation to the 5 topics, that can be implemented or used for advocacy at a range of levels
