Session Description including objectives and expected outcomes (500 words maximum):

The aim of this session is to discuss the elements of the enabling environment that need to be strengthened to improve sanitation services and accelerate access to sanitation and hygiene services for All:

- **Political will** that expresses a strong commitment at the highest level of the country. It has been shown that the countries that have significantly improved their sanitation situation are those in which we have seen such commitment combined with the allocation of public resources dedicated to the sanitation sector and the strong involvement of local authorities and communities in line with the human right to sanitation.
- **National hygiene and sanitation policies and strategies** are essential to sector development. They help translate political will into concrete actions and provide a frame of reference when allocating roles between stakeholders and defining actions to be undertaken.
- **Local level planning** for the entire sanitation chain and the **role of municipalities/districts** (as duty bearers for sanitation services) with the involvement of multiple stakeholders.
- **Sustainable and appropriate financing mechanism** for each sanitation link and for hygiene.
- **Capacity building** for sanitation and hygiene stakeholders.

Adopting a holistic approach to the sanitation chain and considering the different forms of sanitation is essential to meet needs in a way that is sustainable.
