HLP Session Description including objectives and expected outcomes:

The 10th World Water Forum in Bali, Indonesia, presents an opportunity to convene heads of state, ministers, experts, and institutions to discuss the establishment of the Global Water Fund. It is not a new program, it aims to scale up and integrate local-based financing frameworks into a cohesive international program as well as to establish a comprehensive financial mechanism to address the water security challenges worldwide.

The objectives of HLP 1 consist of threefold: firstly, to disseminate the concept of a Global Water Fund among the delegates, fostering understanding and garnering support; secondly, to propose modalities of operation, drawing upon existing framework and engaging with various stakeholders to set up the



operationalization of the concept; and thirdly, to outline a roadmap in developing the concept, including key milestones, targets, and timelines.

The Director General of Infrastructure Financing, Ministry of Public Works and Housing of Indonesia, as the sub-theme 5 coordinator will present the concept of Global Water Fund at the beginning of the panel, and he will pick the example of Indonesia Water Fund concept as a showcasing existing framework that can serve as an embryo for the Global Water Fund.

The discussion topics that will be presented by keynote speakers are:

- 1. Leveraging Water Financing in Indonesia: Exploring mechanisms to integrate Indonesia's water financing framework into Global Water Fund.
- 2. Global Insight on Water Financing Architecture Development Challenges and Opportunities: Sharing experiences and best practices worldwide for the development of the Global Water Fund's financing architecture.
- Advancing Global Water Security Through Collaborative Program
 Development: Identifying areas for collaboration among stakeholders,
 mapping out strategic projects, and developing program to enhance global
 water security through the Global Water Fund's initiatives.
- 4. Private Sector Perspective on Proposed Global Water Fund and Success Story of Water Sector Investment.

The keynote speakers play a pivotal role in lending institutional credibility, authority, and leadership to the development of the Global Water Fund. Their participation signals a commitment, particularly from governments, to provide financial support for this endeavor. Furthermore, they are expected to issue a call to action, aligned with upcoming water events, regarding the next steps in advancing this initiative.

Complementing the keynote speakers, the panelist offer expert perspectives on the practical modalities to the Global Water Fund operazionalitation. They are expected to draw upon relevant examples, both as templates to move forward and as learning experiences. Additionally, they will highlight key areas where agreement, consensus, and commitments are needed to make progress.

The expected key outcome of HLP 1 is collaborative effort among local-based financing frameworks that is shaped into global program to tackle water security challenges. The first effort of this program is the signing of an MoU to officially introduce and establish the cultivation of the Indonesia Water Fund. The MoU



represents a commitment between the Ministry of Public Works and Housing with PT Sarana Multi Infrastruktur (Persero), and PT Danareksa (Persero) to ensure 100% access to clean and safe water.
