Session Description including objectives and expected outcomes (500 words maximum):

Early Warning Systems (EWS) offer a vital line of defense against natural disasters, but current gaps in coverage and effectiveness leave many communities vulnerable. Fostering innovation across all four EW4All pillars is crucial to achieving the "Early Warnings for All" goal. This discussion explores promising social and technological innovations and the role of science-based policies in accelerating EWS advancement. By harnessing the power of social and technological innovations, guided by science-based policies, we can build more effective and inclusive EWS for all. This requires a multi-pronged approach, focusing on community engagement, advanced technologies, and data-driven decision-making. The session will demonstrate the country's experience across the EWS pillars and highlight the need to accelerate innovation in saving lives, reducing losses, and building a more resilient future in the face of increasing disaster risks.

The session objective is to i) Explore cutting-edge social and technological innovations for strengthening Early Warning Systems (EWS) across all four pillars; ii) Foster dialogue and collaboration between stakeholders, including scientists, policymakers, practitioners, community leaders, and private sector representatives. iii) Identify key challenges and opportunities for accelerating innovation in EWS, particularly in developing countries and marginalized communities and iv) Develop recommendations for science-based policies and strategies to support the implementation of innovative EWS solutions.

The takeaway message from the session is to i) Enhance understanding of the latest social and technological innovations for EWS across all four pillars. ii) Collaborative development of innovative solutions to address key challenges in EWS implementation Iii) Identification of best practices and case studies for successful EWS innovation iv) Recommendations for policy changes and funding mechanisms to support the development and deployment of innovative EWS solutions and v) Increased awareness and commitment among stakeholders to invest in and accelerate innovation in EWS for a safer and more resilient future.
